Comprehensive Exams

Comprehensive examinations, or Comps, are administered at the conclusion of all program coursework. Comps indicate the student's proficiency in instructional areas of significance for their future in-state and/or national licensing examinations. Unlike final examinations, comprehensive examinations are not linked to any particular course, but rather test the student's knowledge across one or more general areas of study. All comprehensive examinations results will be entered on the student's permanent academic transcript

All comprehensive exams are taken on-campus and after successfully completing the program. Comprehensive exams are not provided or available online. The comprehensive exam(s) is an evaluation that measures a student's competency of the concepts in the field of the funeral service academic discipline. The exams will cover all courses that are taken within the sciences and the arts required by the ABFSE. Passing the comprehensive exams are a graduation requirement. Comprehensive Exams are Pass/Fail; the student will receive either a "pass" or "fail", not a letter grade for all initial and retake examinations

Comprehensive Exam Requirements

- ❖ The student has successfully completed the program of instruction with a minimum 2.0 cumulative GPA and passing grades in all courses for the AAS
- ❖ For the AAS degree, a student must successfully complete all requirements of the Clinical Embalming program as specified by the College and the American Board of Funeral Service Education, and also be certified by the Clinical Program Director as minimally technically competent in entry level embalming practices
- ❖ The student must be free of all indebtedness to the College prior to taking your comprehensive exams
- ❖ For all programs, the student must have successfully completed all requirements of the Funeral Director Practicum

Comprehensive Exam Retake

First Retake: Should a student exercise the option of taking the first retake, this will constitute a second attempt to pass the comprehensive exams. Our college will allow a student to re-take the failed comprehensive exams if a student does not pass the first attempt. If you fail an exam on your first attempt, then you have an opportunity to retake the comprehensive exams. Retakes will be provided for the individual failed exam/s or subject area. A student will not retake the entire set of comprehensive examinations. Comprehensive Exams are Pass/Fail; the student will receive either a "pass" or "fail", not a letter grade for all initial and retake examinations

Second Retake: Should a student exercise the option of taking the second retake, this will constitute a third attempt to pass the comprehensive exams. Our college will allow a student to re-take the failed

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comprehensive exams if a student does not pass an exam after the second attempt. If you fail an exam after your second attempt, then you have an opportunity to retake the comprehensive exams. Retakes will be provided for the individual failed exam/s or subject area. A student will not retake the entire set of comprehensive examinations. Comprehensive Exams are Pass/Fail; the student will receive either a “pass” or “fail”, not a letter grade for all initial and retake examinations

Students unable to pass the second retake (third attempt) at the minimum score must wait until the following quarter and may then register to retake the entire set of comprehensive examinations. In addition, a student unable to pass the second retake (third attempt) will not have met graduation requirements

CPass Rate: After a student has completed the initial examinations, first retake(s), and second retake(s), the College will, prior to the third retake, conduct a cumulative pass rate for the Arts and Sciences. The Arts and Science sections will be graded independently with a CPass Rate and both must be passed successfully. Those students passing with the CPass Rate of both the Arts and Sciences, will be notified and third retakes will not be necessary. A student who has passed the CPass Rate of both the Arts and Sciences, will have met graduation requirements

Third Retake and Fee: Should a student exercise the option of taking the third retake, this will constitute a fourth attempt to pass the comprehensive exams. Our college will allow a student to re-take the comprehensive exams if a student does not pass the third attempt. Third retakes are not offered directly after the second retake. If you fail an exam on your third attempt, then you have an opportunity to retake the comprehensive exams at the end of the following quarter when they are offered. A student will retake **all** comprehensive examinations. Comprehensive Exams are Pass/Fail; the student will receive either a “pass” or “fail”, not a letter grade for all initial and retake examinations

Students will be permitted to join the (online or on-campus) Capstone Course (Comprehensive Review Course) and Boot Camp, at no cost, offered in the following quarter of the failed second retake and prior to the third retake. Students must contact the college to request enrollment in both the Capstone Course and Boot Camp, prior to the first day these are offered. Third Retake Comprehensive Exam Fee must be paid in advance in order to secure your testing seat and to participate in the study resources available

Third Retake - Comprehensive Exam Fee

A \$600.00 Comprehensive Exam Fee is charged prior to a student taking their third retake. The initial exams, first, and second retake exams are not charged. This fee covers:

- ❖ Development of new comprehensive exams for third retake students
- ❖ On-campus proctoring of comprehensive exams and administration of exams
- ❖ Grading of the exams
